**Hunter College: North Building, Room 611.**

*Non-CUNY visitors must enter the college at the West Building (SW corner of 68<sup>th</sup> St and Lexington) and sign in at the desk with photo ID to get a visitor's badge. Then take the escalator to the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor and then make a right into the corridor through Thomas Hunter Hall (NOT the glass one that crosses Lexington) to the North Building. Take the first set of elevators to the 6<sup>th</sup> floor, turn right on exiting, turn left at Psychology, and enter through the double doors. Room 611 is on your left at the end of the hall. Leave at least 15 minutes from sign in to getting to the room.*
